As in year 8 and year 11, students take part in a structured induction programme and an information evening for students and their parents takes place early in the academic year providing the opportunity for key information to be shared specific to their age and stage of education. Key stage 5 students have access to a dedicated, supervised study area with ICT facilities to allow them to effectively manage their workload. Key Stage 5 students will also have access to careers meetings, workshops and study skills programmes giving them the best possible opportunity to succeed and achieve their potential here in Lismore College!







Excellence in Pastoral Care

In Lismore College each student's safety and welfare is always of paramount importance. We pride ourselves on the quality of our child-centred pastoral care for all students by creating a caring, supportive and nurturing school environment that addresses each student's well-being. A key priority is ensuring we foster positive relationships based on our college's core values of Respect, Kindness, Hope, Commitment and Honesty.

Our excellent pastoral care team is proactive in understanding the individual needs and challenges of our students by fostering a culture of active listening and open communication which empowers our students to develop holistically.

Effective pastoral care underpins our school life and alongside our promoting positive behaviour policy we encourage and support each student to achieve their full potential. Lismore College is an all-inclusive school in which all students are valued for their unique contributions, abilities, and achievements. We promote diversity, acceptance and a sense of belonging for everyone in our College community.

Our Pastoral structure supports our caring child-centred ethos where every member of staff has a responsibility to ensure each student feels safe and gets the maximum benefit from their time in school. Each student will have a dedicated Form Teacher who will have a detailed knowledge of their individual needs, aspirations, interests and academic progress and will work with teachers, parents/carers and external organisations in supporting their learning and development. The Head of Year, supported by the Key Stage Leader, oversees the general welfare of all students in the year group. We also provide a Peer Mentoring Scheme which provides additional support for Year 8 students making the transition from primary to post-primary education.

Lismore emphasises the importance of a strong link between home and school in order to help ensure full attendance, completion of homework and revision for assessments. The pastoral team encourages parents/carers to communicate effectively with school to help support their child reaching their full potential.

SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION

Lismore College has a primary responsibility for the care, welfare and safety of all in our care. The aim of the safeguarding and child protection policy is to protect our students by ensuring that everyone has clear guidance on the detection and management of any situation where abuse or neglect of a child are suspected or disclosed. The central principle that our staff support is that every child has the fundamental right to be safe from harm and to have proper care given to their physical. emotional and spiritual well-being.

ANTI-BULLYING

Lismore is completely opposed to bullying and will not tolerate any form of bullying behaviour. It is entirely contrary to our values and ethos as a caring community and is unequivocally rejected by all members of our staff. 

In Lismore our Circles of Support provide wrap around pastoral care for every student. The diagram above details the network of support with the student at the centre.



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Learning Support Centre

The Learning Support Centre is at the heart of our new school and encapsulates the school ethos of Lismore College – "Lismore is a school for all"! We are very proud that Lismore College is representative of the entire community.

We warmly welcome students with a wide range of physical, learning and health and wellbeing needs from feeder schools and schools from the wider community. Every student is an individual and we strive to meet their individual needs with a tailored transition plan that allows each child to settle in at their own pace, with the support of staff and parents. Preparation is key to a smooth transition for our new students. LSC staff collaborate with primary school teachers and SENCO's, support agencies and health and social care staff to make sure we create the best environment for our students.

The students in the Learning Support Centre benefit from the excellent facilities of our new college in mainstream and within the centre. In the centre, our spacious classrooms have access to a support room with ICT facilities, a quiet room and outside space. In addition, the learning support centre has a kitchen area and utility area to allow students to develop their life skills. A hygiene room with hoist and shower facilities; individual toilets and cloakrooms and a medical room are also provided for our students.

The curriculum is balanced to provide a range of learning experiences that includes social skills, life skills and health and wellbeing. Exercise and movement is part of our daily routine. All students in Key Stage 3 have access to weekly swimming lessons in South Lake Leisure Centre in addition to PE lessons in school. We use structured spelling and reading programmes as well as developing numeracy skills through interactive lessons and online Maths games.

Trips and days outs are organised throughout the year to celebrate the success of our students, for example this year we are visiting the W5 Halloween Workshops, the Christmas Pantomime in the Grand Opera House in Belfast and Emerald Park for the end of year trip.

Our Key Stage 3 students will progress to Key Stage 4 and will have access to a range of qualifications from entry level, OCN level and GCSE depending on their interests and abilities. This year we also have a group of students who have progressed to Post 16 and who are taught both within the centre and mainstream. They have the consistency of the supportive environment, trained staff and access to the broad and balanced curriculum available within mainstream subjects.

Year 8 student places, in the Key Stage 3 Learning Support Class and the Key Stage 3 Autism Specific Class, are identified by the Education Authority and parents are informed of places by the EA at the same time as mainstream students and families. Individual appointments can be made through the school office to visit the LSC.



A School that supports learning

In Lismore College we are committed to meeting the individual learning needs of all students and aim to create an environment where every student can succeed academically. We recognise the important relationship between high quality pastoral support and academic achievement. Our Learning Support Department comprising of the Learning Support Coordinator, Specialist Teacher for assessment of access arrangements and a team of highly committed classroom assistant staff, work in collaboration with our supportive parents/carers and the expert services provided by a variety of external agency staff such as Autism Advisory Intervention Services, Vision Sensory Support, Education Psychology, Behaviour Support Team, EA Transition Officer and EA Careers Service.

All students on the additional needs register have an Individual Education Plan put in place with reasonable adjustments made as appropriate to ensure that our students can overcome their barriers to learning.

Our students can also receive additional support from our Learning Mentor who provides emotional and academic support as appropriate.

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)

CEIAG provides exposure to ideas that students may not get elsewhere. Supports students to understand how the skills and knowledge they gain in school will be relevant throughout their life. Addresses different sectors and skills to help you to broaden students' horizons.

Careers education is embedded from Year 8 to allow students time to think about and explore a number of potential career pathways. Our dedicated Careers Team, led by our Vice-Principal, will ensure all students understand how the skills and knowledge they gain in school will be relevant throughout their life. Our trained staff, as well as our local Careers Advisory service will continue to address different sectors and skills to help students broaden their horizons.

We were delighted to be awarded The Quality in Careers Standard which is the national quality award for careers education, information and advice and guidance in schools, colleges, and work-based learning. It is fully aligned with the Gatsby Benchmarks and fully complies with the Department for Education's Statutory Guidance.

We have strong links with local businesses and services to afford our students the opportunity to experience the world of work through a work experience placement. These placements are invaluable for students, particularly in developing their interpersonal skills.

Transition

Lismore recognises that the transition from primary school to secondary school is a significant stage in the social, emotional and educational life of each of our students and their families. To ensure a smooth transition we have forged excellent relationships with the local feeder primary schools. We understand the importance of managing this transition effectively so that the students can enjoy and make amazing memories during their time in school. We place great importance on supporting every Year 8 student as they settle into life at Lismore College.

Key Stages in our Transition Programme:

- December P7 Taster days which give students the opportunity to visit our school, participate in a range of practical activities in different subject areas and also get to meet some of our students and staff.
- In January of P7 our senior staff will visit partner primary schools with past students to answer any questions the P7 students might have.
- In June of the P7 year, members of the Year 8 pastoral team will visit our partner primary schools to meet with the teachers of the students transferring to Lismore . We are provided with comprehensive information about each student's academic progress and any pastoral concerns.
- In June of the P7 year, we also invite Year 8 students who have gained a place in Lismore College and their parents into school for an induction evening. Parents/carers and students will receive key information and have the opportunity to meet with the Year 8 pastoral team and senior staff. This is also an opportunity to meet other students who will be starting their Lismore journey.
- In August of Year 8, students enjoy a phased entry into school without large numbers of students in other year groups. During this time in August they will complete a fun induction programme where the focus is on building positive relationships and getting to know their classmates. There will also be a face to face parent-tutor meeting for parents to inform the college about anything that can help make the transition smoother.

Peer Mentoring

Each Year 8 form class will also be assigned two Post-16 peer mentors who will meet with the students every morning during registration. Our excellent student peer mentors demonstrate empathy and actively listen to our new year 8 students to ensure a smooth transition from primary to secondary school.

Their aims are:

- Be role models for our younger students
- Help them to make happy and caring relationships
- Assist them on finding their way around the school
- Build their confidence and self-esteem
- Be an active listener about any concerns they may have
- Encourage them to take part in extracurricular activities
- Help with the organisation of their books and equipment



Awards

We are very proud and privileged to have been awarded a number of awards during the past 2 years which affirms the excellent day-to-day practice within our school.

IQM National Inclusion Champion 2023 - This award was for our inclusive practice. This award was received by 8 schools across the UK and we were the only school in NI to be awarded.

Derrytrasna Commendation Award for Outstanding Pastoral Care - This award is based on submissions from parents and carers, and we were the only school out of over 200 to receive this commendation.

Middletown Centre for Autism Accredited Award - We have been a leading school with the new accredited autism award through Middletown Centre for Autism and are currently involved in setting the standards of attainment for future applicants across Northern Ireland.

The Quality in Careers Standard, through Investor in Careers - This is the national quality award for careers education, information and advice and guidance in schools, colleges, and work-based learning. It is fully aligned with the Gatsby Benchmarks and fully complies with the Department for Education's Statutory Guidance.

The Investors in Mental Health Award - We were awarded this award due to our commitment to providing positive mental health within school.

Investors in Mental Health is an initiative from AWARE, the Depression Charity for Northern Ireland, that recognises and celebrates individuals, schools and organisations making significant contributions to improving mental health within their field.

Admissions Criteria

In the case of students who have special circumstances the Board of Governors will determine the merits of individual cases and may offer a place without regard to the Admissions Criteria. Written evidence will be required to support any such request and must be given on or attached to the Transfer Form.

In the event of the number of students applying for places in Year 8 in September being greater than the Admissions number, the Board of Governors will apply the following criteria in the order set down below.

- 1. Students who are the oldest child or have older *siblings currently enrolled in Lismore College.
- 2. Students whose normal place of residence is within the Parish of Moyraverty or Seagoe.
- 3. Students whose normal place of residence is outside the Parish of Moyraverty or Seagoe and attended traditional primary schools:

4. Students whose parent/guardian is an employee of the school or who has been appointed to take up a post in the school.

In the event of oversubscription within any of the above categories the following sub-criteria will be applied.

- 1. Students whose Transfer Application expresses Lismore as a first preference and who are the oldest child or currently have older siblings in attendance at Lismore College.
- 2. Students whose Transfer Application expresses Lismore as a first preference and who are the oldest child or have had siblings previously in attendance at Lismore College.
- 3. Students whose Transfer Application expresses Lismore as a first preference and do not qualify in 1 or 2 above.
- 4. Students whose Transfer application expresses a second preference for Lismore College.
- 5. Students whose Transfer application expresses a third preference for Lismore College.
- 6. Students whose Transfer application expresses a fourth preference for Lismore College.
- 7. Students whose Transfer application expresses a fifth preference for Lismore College.

In the event that, at any stage of the above sub-criteria being applied, there is more than one applicant for the final place, a random selection will be made to complete the admissions selection.

*The use of the word sibling is defined as children who, at the date of their application, have a child of the family currently enrolled at the school. The phrase 'child of the family' covers children fostered, adopted etc. and avoids having to define all the various permutations of sibling
